NEW TREATMENT TRIALS

Our foundation, in collaboration with Illinois CancerCare, helps bring the latest nationally renowned clinical cancer research trials right here to our community—giving cancer patients and their families greater access to advanced treatment options and greater HOPE close to home.

EDUCATION AND ADVOCACY

Gifts to the Foundation bring us closer to cures through support of educational events and training for volunteer advocates. The Foundation understands that the best care we can provide is through prevention. We partner with community experts to educate our community on steps to stay healthy.

PATIENT SUPPORT

The Foundation's Trust in Hope program provides compassion and support to cancer patients and their families during the holidays. In the last nine years, nearly 2,000 Thanksgiving meals have been delivered and over 125 families with nearly 300 children have received holiday gifts. Foundation grants also provide transportation assistance, assessment tools, lymphedema support and other therapies that help patients deal with the side effects of cancer treatment.

GENETIC TESTING

The Foundation is excited to announce new funding for a Community Pancreatic Screening Program, providing genetic testing at no charge to first and second-generation relatives of individuals diagnosed with pancreatic cancer. Last year, the Foundation funded a new pancreatic screening program for Illinois CancerCare, P.C. pancreatic patients to look at genetic mutations that may help identify family members at high risk for developing pancreatic cancer.

Together, these programs empower families to understand their risks, provide relief from uncertainty and make informed decisions about their healthcare. The Foundation also supports other genetic screening programs to identify hereditary cancer, with emphasis on families at risk for hereditary colorectal and breast cancer. Additionally, we support studies that offer targeted therapies to patients whose tumors have "driver mutations" found through molecular sequencing.
